Robert S. Tucker, an FDNY Foundation Board Member, was sworn in as the 35th Fire Commissioner of the New York City Fire Department on Monday, Aug. 12, 2024, at the FDNY Fire Academy on Randall's Island.

This is an extraordinary accomplishment for Commissioner Tucker and his family. We thank him for his years of support as an FDNY Foundation Board Member and his dedication to helping the FDNY. Commissioner Tucker brings decades of public safety experience to the role, having previously served as a special assistant to the Queens County District Attorney and as chairman and CEO of T&M Protection Resources, a globally recognized leader in security solutions and cyber intelligence.

## SECOND CHANCE CEREMONY: CPR TRAINING SAVES LIVES



In honor of National EMS Week 2024, the FDNY held its 28th-annual Second Chance Ceremony on May 23, 2024, at Liberty Warehouse in Brooklyn. The special event reunited eight cardiac arrest patients with the FDNY members, bystanders and other first responders who helped save their lives.

Several of this year's survivors received cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) from bystanders before on-duty FDNY members arrived. Immediate CPR, coupled with defibrillation within the first few minutes after sudden cardiac arrest, can greatly increase a patient's chance of survival. The Second Chance Ceremony has reunited more than 200 patients with members of the FDNY who saved their lives.

The 28th-annual Second Chance Ceremony was held May 23, 2024, at Liberty Warehouse in Brooklyn.


### **CPR SAVES LIVES**


The graduates successfully completed a challenging academic program that focused on leadership and strength as core values, as well as the academic and physical skills necessary for emergency responders.


### **FDNY Officers Management Institute**

# BETTER PREPARED: FDNY FOUNDATION FUNDS UWF PROGRAM WITH PHYSICAL FITNESS TRAINING




Any woman who is interested in becoming an FDNY firefighter can participate in the United Women Firefighters (UWF) of New York's Female Firefighter Training Program.


